## Dear Brothers,

Following our discussion on Saturday, May 10, we concluded (by a vote of 6 in favor and 1 against) that a previous divorce does **not** automatically exclude a man from serving in church leadership, including the role of shepherd (elder).

While we affirm that marriage is a covenant and believe that any previous divorce should be evaluated carefully, we agreed that it does not disqualify a currently married man from being considered for the role of elder.

In reviewing the biblical qualifications for elders (Titus 1:6–9, 1 Timothy 3:1–7, and other passages), we agreed that the following represent the minimal qualifications for an elder:

- Married, with an exemplary relationship
- Has children (at least one; although some passages suggest two or more)
- A faithful Christian who models exemplary Christian character
- Widely accepted by the congregation as a godly man

Thank you for your thoughtful study, prayer, and discussion on this important matter.
